


Water You Thinking Keep Washington Green!


What can you do at home?

Let Your Lawn Go Dormant!

While it's tempting to spend **HUNDEREDS** of gallons of water keeping your lawn green, it's time to let it go dormant. Grass can live water free for a month! Save lots of water and accept your beautiful brown lawn. Can't stand the color? Replace your grass with beautiful native plants instead for a vibrant, water-friendly ourdoor space! Save Water & Your Money!

Wasting water costs money. Lots of it. Save your hard-earned money by conserving water at home. Your family could save a much as \$170 a year by implementing water conservation strategies! Plant a Tree... or Two!

Trees are actually an amazing water saving strategy! Trees capture and send rainwater back into the ground replenishing our drinking water, they increase shade, and native plants are naturally adapted to be drought tolerant here.
